

The Van Doren Scholarship

2025 Checklist & Application

Thank you for your interest in applying for a Van Doren Scholarship. The Van Doren Application consists of two components:

- (a) The written sections that include evidence of your academic performance and character.
- (b) A personal interview with the Scholarship Committee if you are chosen as a finalist.

For best results, follow these instructions carefully.

1. The postmark deadline for complete applications is March 20, 2025. Applications received with later postmark dates will not be considered.
2. Applications are deemed complete when we have received each of the following:
 - a. Your 2025 application form. This is available on-line at our website (www.vandorenscholars.com) or in hard copy form at most Somerset County Public Library branches and secondary school guidance offices.
 - b. A legal signature indicating that you (and your parent or legal guardian, if under 21) acknowledge your eligibility and other requirements of the competition.
 - c. A recent academic transcript from your current secondary or post-secondary school.
 - d. Please provide two recent letters of reference, written during the current academic year that attest to your academic achievements and personal character.

NOTE: IF ANY OF THE DOCUMENTS IN (C) TO (D) ABOVE ARE BEING SENT SEPARATELY FROM YOUR APPLICATION (AS IS OFTEN THE CASE WITH OFFICIAL SCHOOL TRANSCRIPTS, FOR INSTANCE), IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO ASSURE THAT THE SENDERS ADHERE TO THE POSTMARK DEADLINE.

Using the Downloadable Application Form

The application form available at our website is a fillable PDF file that may be completed offline using your computer. Simply download the file and open it locally using the free Adobe Reader. Place your screen cursor in any field on the form and type your responses directly into the space provided. You may discover that you can paste text into a field from another application, but we encourage you to take your time and verify that your answers are complete. You may save the form locally. When you have completed each of the questions and essays, print and sign your form and submit it by mail

Using the Pre-printed Application Form

The application form available at Somerset County libraries, and school guidance offices, has been printed in advance. We prefer typewritten responses. If you must handwrite your answers, be sure to write neatly and legibly.

Part Two: Academic Status

8. Describe any special studies (i.e., art, music, etc.) you are currently undertaking.
9. What is your planned or current major field of study?
10. List important hobbies or special interests.

Part Four: Self-Assessment: Short Essays

Questions #11 through #14 are best answered as brief essays (suggested length 200 words each). All applicants, other than returning Van Doren scholars, are required to answer questions #11, #12, and #13. If you are a returning Van Doren Scholar, please answer only questions #13, #14, and #15.

Peter Van Doren, a Peapack-Gladstone resident, directed his estate to award scholarships to students who exhibit a lifelong incentive for learning and strong character.

11. One way to define role model is to say that this is a person who helps you to become the best version of yourself. Do you have a role model? If so, what is one quality of this person that you find worthy of emulating? If not, what is a quality that you possess that is worthy of perhaps inspiring others?

12. Describe how you are currently making a contribution to your community and, looking ahead, explain what you plan to do in the future.

13. What have you learned about yourself in the past year?

14. How does your college experience over the past year qualify you to continue as a Van Doren scholar?

15. Most Van Doren scholars use their awards to help pay for basic college costs, and this is something we expect. Once in a while, however, we find that the money was used for something different, such as to pursue an opportunity that otherwise would not be possible. In a sentence or two, tell us how you used your Van Doren scholarship award.

I am aware that in order to receive a Van Doren Scholarship, I must be a full-time undergraduate student at an approved, accredited four-year college or university, a two-year college, or a post-secondary trade or nursing school.
